Candidates with a non-terminal degree must document exceptional accomplishments in their field or in the teaching of Chinese language and must be approved for a terminal degree exception before hire.

Applications should include cover letter, statement of teaching philosophy (2 pages max), example syllabus, representative sample of teaching evaluations (3 pages max), CV, and contacts for three confidential letters of recommendation, at least one of which should address the candidate's teaching record. Applications received by December 17th will receive full consideration. Finalists will be asked to submit a teaching portfolio.
